Submissions

Authors are invited to submit electronically (PDF format) a non-anonymous extended abstract. The extended abstract should be typeset using 11-point or larger fonts, in a single-column, single-spacing format, and reasonable margins. Submissions deviating significantly from these guidelines risk rejection without consideration of their merits. The length of the submission should be at most 14 pages excluding the title page, bibliography and appendices. Referees are not required to read appendices; the paper should be intelligible without them. Submissions must not substantially duplicate work that was published elsewhere, or work that any of the authors has submitted in parallel to a journal or to any other conference or workshop with proceedings.

Best Paper Award

All submissions are eligible for the Best Paper award. The committee may decide to split the award between multiple papers, or to decline to make an award.
